



Popcorn 'n Cranberries Christmas Garland

This garland is done completely in crochet and using no beads.

Difficulty Level: Easy

Supplies:

Worsted weight yarn in 2 colors:

Off-white (or white if you prefer the non-buttery type of popcorn *smile*)
and a Christmas-y red. (I used Winter White & Barn Red)

Yarn needle

Size H crochet hook

Popcorn Stitch: Ch 4, then 5 dc in 1st ch st, drop loop from hook, insert hook in top of first dc of group, pull dropped loop through stitch, pull snug. This will cause the dc group to pull into a little puffy ball.

Start: Begin with the white, do your first popcorn stitch. Ch 4 and begin the next popcorn stitch in the 3rd ch from the hook. When finished this set of popcorn stitches, ch 2 and finish off.

Switch to the red color. Begin “cranberry” popcorn stitches with a sl st in the ending chain of the white popcorn, ch 4 and start the red popcorn stitch in the 3rd chain from hook. Continue popcorn stitches as above. When finished this set of popcorn stitches, ch 2 and finish off.

Switch back to the white and continue on.

Alternate with 2-3 popcorn and 1-2 cranberries in between, finishing and tying off ends when changing colors.

Using a yarn needle, weave ends into the popcorn stitches and snip excess yarn.
